

Hooksett Automated Containerized Trash and Recycling Curbside Collection Program

The Town of Hooksett has implemented a new program to dispose of waste within the Town. There are many benefits of the program including ease of use, cost reductions for taxpayers over the current method, cleaner look, fewer instances of animal interference, and going **GREEN !!!**



HOW IT WORKS!

- ✓ Recycling will be curbside, in the mobile recycling trailer and at the Recycling and Transfer Center.
- ✓ Residents will be provided (2) containers: (1) for trash and (1) for recyclables.
- ✓ The barrels are Town owned with serial code #'s attached to the address they are delivered to. If you choose not to use the new barrels, call, we will collect the barrels, and you can bring your material to the Recycling and Transfer Center. Barrels will be reissued if you change your mind!!!
- ✓ If you have old trash cans to recycle, please do so at the Recycling and Transfer Center.
- ✓ Recyclables must be placed in the marked container separate from trash.
- ✓ **Trash** must be **bagged** and must fit within the container with the lid closed.(HOUSEHOLD TRASH ONLY)
- ✓ **Recyclables** must be **loose** (not bagged) and co-mingled (there is no need to separate recyclables by type) within the container with the lid closed.
- ✓ In order to maximize space, recyclables should be broken down.
- ✓ Containers must be wheeled out to the curb no later than 7:00 am on collection day.
- ✓ **Notice:** Your curbside collection day at this time will not change. Time of collection may be different.
- ✓ Remove the containers from the street at the end of collection day.
- ✓ Loose trash or trash outside of the container will not be picked up.
- ✓ Trash and recyclables are also accepted at the Recycling and Transfer Center
- ✓ The more we **Recycle**, the more money we save!
- ✓ Automated collection trucks (like shown above) will pick up trash and recyclables (**there is one truck for trash and one for recyclables**)
- ✓ Please remember to clear ice and snow from an area at curbside for containers in the winter!
- ✓ Containers must be separated at least 2-3 feet from each other, so that the truck can pick them up. The apron or end of your driveway is a perfect spot for containers.
- ✓ Place the container at least 5 feet from objects (such as mailboxes, fences, telephone poles, etc.)
- ✓ Do not place under low hanging branches or wires.
- ✓ The lid must open from the road side; handle faces house.
- ✓ Something to identify the barrel as belonging to your address may be added under the serial # (example would be a #7 if you are at #7or something tied to the handle).
